| Course details | This course describes the skills and knowledge required to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines. This course applies to all workers who may be required to provide CPR, in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings. |

| | Specifically, all participants must be able to perform two (2) minutes of uninterrupted CPR on an adult manikin and two (2) minutes of CPR on an infant manikin, on the floor. If you are unable to perform this practical task, we can issue you with a non-accredited certificate of participation. |

| Recognition of prior learning | Students choosing to undertake RPL will need to be sent an RPL guide for their course. To request an RPL guide, please contact our team. In order to be eligible for RPL, the student must demonstrate currency in that particular subject. i.e. a student cannot submit evidence from 5 years prior and request it be applied directly to their new competency. They must show how they have since applied those skills and that they are current, including any practical skills associated to the program. |
